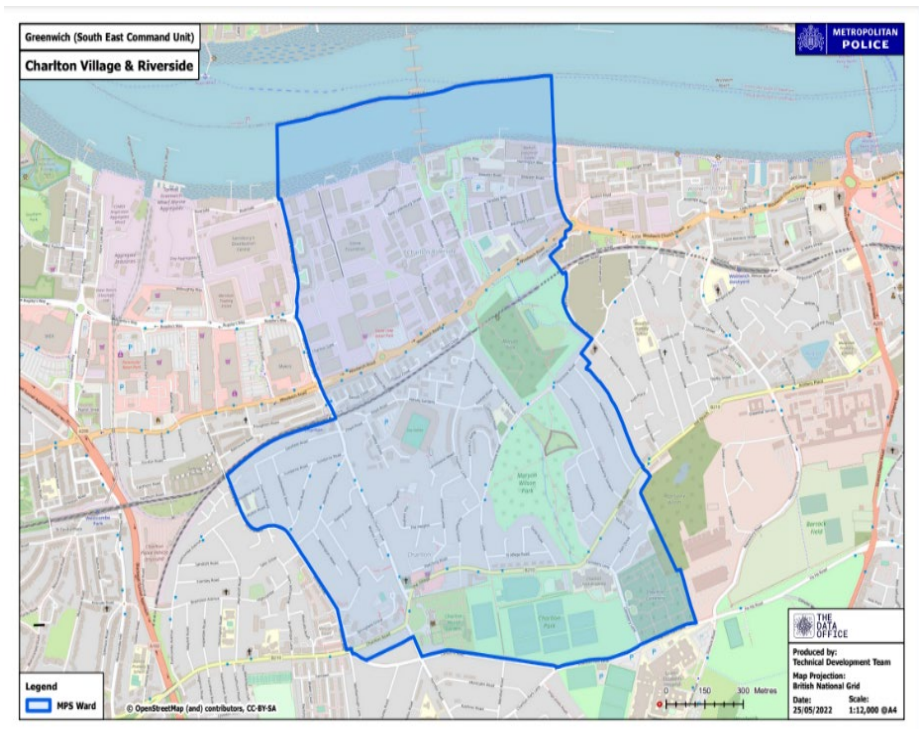


Charlton Village & Riverside Safer Neighbourhood Team Newsletter June 2025 Greenwich Police

Updates from Charlton Village & Riverside Ward

Over the past month, in response to reports of anti-social behaviour (ASB) across the ward, the Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) has continued to conduct patrols in the following areas:

Officers continue to support members of the public and local businesses through reassurance visits and targeted patrols, focusing particularly on vehicle theft, shoplifting, burglaries, hate crimes and Anti-Social-Behaviour incidents.

Ward priorities patrols

Our Team is actively conducting ward priority patrols based on the three main priorities established during the last ward panel meeting on 23 April 2025:

- Drug dealing at Charlton Park and Charlton House
- Anti-social behaviour on and around Charlton Church Lane
- Business engagement along the industrial area of Charlton Riverside.

Community intelligence

A drug operation was successfully completed in collaboration with the housing association following a report about drugs being stored in a block of flats. The collection was carried out and an investigation is ongoing.

Actions against ASB

A **Community Protection Warning** (a written notice issued by police under the Anti-Social Behaviour Crime and Policing Act 2014) was issued in our ward to prevent persistent, unreasonable behaviour negatively impacting the community's quality of life. This is part of our broader efforts to maintain public order and ensure community safety.

School Engagement

On 11 June, the team visited the **Fossdene Primary School** and gave talks to several classes about the role of the police. Pupils had the chance to use the police radio, try on police hats, and ask many questions. We also discussed "stranger danger", emergency numbers to remember and general safety rules. This visit was part of the school's Aspiration week curriculum.

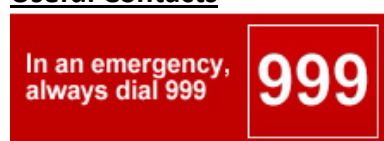
