Theft of catalytic converters

Yes, they are at it again. After a lull in this type of crime the criminals are at it again and this time in broad daylight. They recently attempted to steal from a car in Delafield Road. Fortunately they were challenged and made off having done considerable damage to the car. You can protect your catalytic converter. The RAC give the following advice: park your car with the side closet to the cat. right up against the kerb, boost your home security (CCTV, external lights etc.) to cover your parked car and add an underside lock (Catloc) to your vehicle.

Share your thoughts on women's safety

Following a series of serious incidents which have shaken women's confidence in policing the Met are working hard to restore faith in their service. Their latest initiative is aimed at understanding, at a local level, concerns women have about travelling in their own area. The Walk and Talk scheme is for women (individually or in a group) to book a confidential walk around their area with a female police officer. The police are inviting women to tell them about their experiences and concerns. Do you feel unsafe in a particular area? Tell the police. In working in partnership with the community the police can better understand our neighbourhood and help make us all feel safer. Ward Boundary Changes

The May local council elections were conducted on the new ward boundaries determined by the Boundary Commission. There have been changes to the old Charlton ward which has resulted in two new Wards: Charlton Village and Riverside and Charlton Hornfair. We are in Village and Riverside. There are no changes imminent to the policing structure. So we will continue to be policed on the old ward system. The change-over will occur when the Met's computer systems have been reconfigured to generate crime stats mapped onto the new wards. This is unlikely to take place till next year.
